We'd appreciate it if you would help keep some of these lessons top of mind by talking to them about the importance of staying away from GVEC's outdoor electrical equipment (like those big green boxes and electric poles), obeying warning signs and taking special care when around anything that's electrical. Here's one last lesson: a crossword puzzle with just a few of the lessons Louie teaches.

ACROSS

- Unplug cords by pulling the plug. Don't pull **this.**
- Substations are dangerous places. Stay away and obey **these.**
- Keep **these** and other objects away from power outlets.
- Keep balloons and **these** away from power lines.
- If you see a downed power line, do **this** and report what you saw to an adult.

DOWN

Safety Smarts Word Search

Hey Kids! GVEC knows you've learned a lot about being safe around electricity from Louie the Lightning Bug and other GVEC safety presentations at school. But, have you shared that information with your family? Here's a quick way to get the word out: see if they can do this word search in 5 minutes or less. Answers are on last page of the packet.



Overload: If you plug too many electrical items into an outlet or extension cord, it could overload your home's electric system and cause a fire.

Shock: Water and electricity don't mix, so don't touch anything that runs on electricity with wet hands, like a hair straightener when you're in the bathroom or a radio around the pool. If you do, you may receive a shock.

Conductor: Did you know shiny mylar balloons can be a conductor of electricity and are just as dangerous as kites if they get tangled in a power line? If one gets stuck, leave it alone.

Ignite: Never put anything like a towel or shirt over a lamp shade. It can overheat and ignite, causing a fire.

Electric cord: Use the plug, not the electric cord, to unplug an appliance. Pulling the cord can damage the wires inside and cause the appliance to shock you.

Power line: Make sure your family doesn't put a pool, trampoline, or other playground equipment beneath a power line. It can be dangerous if you or something you're carrying comes in contact with an overhead line.

Wattage: Check labels on lamps to make sure you're using the right size of lightbulb. One that's too large (has too much wattage) can overheat and cause a fire.






GVEC purchased its first all-electric vehicle in October 2018, nicknamed SPARKY by a social media poll.

Electric vehicles are powered by LITHIUM-ION BATTERIES.


